ENROLLMENT & REFUNDS

To guarantee a place in a class, **tuition must be paid at the time of enrollment, please.** Only enrolled students in their respective class are welcome in the class.

CANCELLATION/REFUND POLICY

Tuition is non-refundable unless cancelled by the parent at least one week prior to the start of class. In the event a class is cancelled by Arts Visalia, a full refund will be given.

DROP OFF/PICK UP

Please remember to pick up your children's work by Saturday, October 5th, 2019, as the artwork may be unavailable after this date.
